Ice Safety Tips:

- NO ICE IS SAFE ICE always assume the ice is unsafe.
- Call a local bait shop for ice conditions.
- Always have ice picks and rope within easy reach.
- Carry a marine radio, cell phone in a bag, GPS, compass.
- Check the weather forecast and be prepared for conditions.
- Hire an experienced local ice fishing guide.
- Wear a USCG approved life jacket or wearable flotation device.
- Let someone know where you plan to go and when you plan to return.
- Stop and check the ice thickness often, ice conditions change frequently.
- Travel with a buddy.
- Don't travel at night.
- If the ice cracks, crawl or roll back the way you came.
- If you fall in the water, STAY CALM, climb out of the ice in the direction that you came. Get into dry clothes as soon as possible. Seek medical treatment if hypothermia has set in.
- Avoid any creek / river mouth.
- NO ICE IS SAFE ICE always assume the ice is unsafe.

Call 911 to report any emergency



Ice Characteristics:

There are several types of ice that can be found on the Chequamegon Bay.

- Clear blue ice is stronger than ice that is layered and mixed with snow.
- Pack ice, formed from ice flows, has many weak joints and is unsafe to walk on.
- Ice along the shore can be weak and unpredictable.
- Pressure ridges can change throughout the day and may have open water around them.
- Gaps can form between cracks in the ice.
 These gaps can change from inches to many feet during the time you are on the ice.
- Water current weakens ice around the breakwall, ore dock, creeks and culverts and other structures.
- Ice will begin to degrade any time the temperature is above 32°F.

Ice Thickness Guidelines:

• NO ICE IS SAFE ICE – always assume the ice is unsafe.

2" Thick STAY OFF!

4" Thick Ice Fishing / Walking

6" Thick Snowmobile / ATV

12" Thick Car / Small Pickup

15" Thick Medium Pickup
